This systematic scrutiny aids in informed decision-making, ensuring alignment with stakeholder needs and expectations. It fosters a culture of continuous improvement, propelling innovation, and refining strategies

The relevance of students' feedback analysis lies in its pivotal role in fostering a student-centric educational ecosystem. As a central mechanism for quality enhancement, the IQAC utilizes student feedback as a crucial metric to gauge the effectiveness of academic programs, teaching methodologies, and overall learning experiences. The analysis of this feedback offers a direct line to understanding the pulse of student satisfaction, concerns, and aspirations within the institution. By incorporating student perspectives, IQAC can identify areas needing improvement, align curriculum with evolving industry needs, enhance teaching methodologies, and refine institutional policies.

Feedbacks were collected from nearly 30% of the passing out students and their opinion on 11 various objectives were collected. Responses were categorized into Excellent, Good, Average and Poor. This iterative process of feedback analysis not only ensures accountability and transparency but also empowers students, making them active partners in shaping the quality and relevance of their education. Ultimately, integrating student feedback within the IQAC framework contributes significantly to the continuous enhancement and refinement of the educational standards and practices within the institution.










4.The syllabus was simple to understand 358 responses


5. In the class, the teacher completed almost the whole syllabus 358 responses








8. The laboratory activities expanded my knowledge of the concepts and enabled me to apply theory with practicals.


9. The faculties are qualified and experienced, and the classes are active. 358 responses


10. The evaluation procedure is impartial and fair. 358 responses

11. Most teachers use modern teaching tools like PowerPoint presentations, websites, multi-media, e- content, etc.






12. The New Canteen and refreshment facilities were very much better 358 responses


13. The infrastructure including Ladies Hostel, Washrooms, Rest rooms, and drinking water facility were very useful 358 responses

Regarding the newly constructed library, digital library, and theatre facilities, 54.5 % of students gave it an Excellent rating, 26.5 percent gave it a Very Good rating, 18.2 percent gave it a Good rating, and 0.8% gave it a Poor rating.



RECOMMENDATIONS

As per the feedback collected by IQAC for the academic year 2022-23, Students have overwhelmingly expressed their appreciation for the enhanced library and theater facilities, marking a significant shift in their academic and cultural experiences. The infrastructure facilities like washrooms and restrooms were also appreciated. The curriculum impacts on students were not that satisfactory as the syllabus has to be revised in accordance with the recent advances. Its highly recommended to include new generation courses in the next academic year and also courses to promote employability have to be included. Content delivery through e-resources is also highly recommended.
