



The Following graphical representations show the Teachers Feedback Analysis




The pie chart represents the responses of teachers regarding their perception of whether the current syllabus is need-based. The largest segment of the pie chart, at 54%, suggests that a significant majority of teachers believe that the current syllabus is Excellent. 39% of the teachers suggested it as Good and 7% as Average.




The responses from instructors about how they view the current curriculum syllabus are displayed in the pie chart. The largest group of teachers, 51% of them, is those who believe that the curriculum's current syllabus is Good. 37% of the teachers believed it as Excellent and 12% as Average.






Teachers' opinions on how well defined the program outcomes are in the syllabi are represented in the pie chart. The segment at 45% indicates that a substantial portion of teachers believes that the program outcomes in the syllabi are excellently defined. The largest segment, comprising 50%, represents teachers who perceive the program outcomes in the syllabi as Good. The smallest segment, at 5%, is assigned to the Average category.




The pie chart shows the teachers' replies when asked if they think the course satisfies the needs of the students. The segment at 48% indicates that a significant portion of teachers believes that the course excellently fulfills the needs of the students. 45% of the teachers believes this as Good. The smallest segment at 7% is assigned to the Average category.






The pie chart represents the responses of teachers regarding their perception of whether the curriculum enhances employability. The part at 57% shows that a sizable majority of educators think it as Excellent. 33% rated it as Good and 10% as Average.




The responses of teachers on how well they believe laboratories and resources are being used are displayed in a pie chart. The largest component, at 63%, shows that a significant percentage of teachers think that lab and ICT resource usage is Excellent. 37% of the teachers responded this as Very Good.






The pie chart represents the responses of teachers regarding their perception of access to reading material in the general library. The largest area, at 62%, shows that a significant percentage of teachers think the general library provides excellent access to reading material. 35% of the teachers responded this as Very Good and 3% as Good.




The responses of teachers about how they view access to digital libraries and the National Digital Library of India (NDLI) are displayed in a pie chart. The majority of teachers, as evidenced by the largest group (68%), think that is Excellent. 31% believes that is Very Good. A very tiny percentage of teachers appear to have a more neutral or mixed viewpoint of the availability of online library platforms, as indicated by the small segment for Average at 1%





The pie chart represents the responses of teachers regarding their rating of the infrastructure, including Ladies hostel, Washrooms, Rest rooms, Drinking water facility, Canteens, and Refreshment facilities. The largest category, at 67%, illustrates that a significant number of teachers thinks this infrastructure Excellent. 33% think it as Very Good. The lack of a section labeled Good or Average suggests that not a single teacher gave the infrastructure a good or average rating.



The replies from teachers about how they rated the recreational facility more especially, the GEMS Theatre are displayed in the pie chart. 82% of the teachers think the Recreational Facility, especially the GEMS Theatre is Excellent. 18% of the teachers rated this as Very Good.



CONCLUSIONS

The feedback gathered reflects both areas of strength and opportunities for improvement among our teaching staff. It emphasizes the importance of continued support for professional development and highlights aspects where adjustments or enhancements can further elevate the educational experience. All the teaching staffs were satisfied with the institutional facilities.
